Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

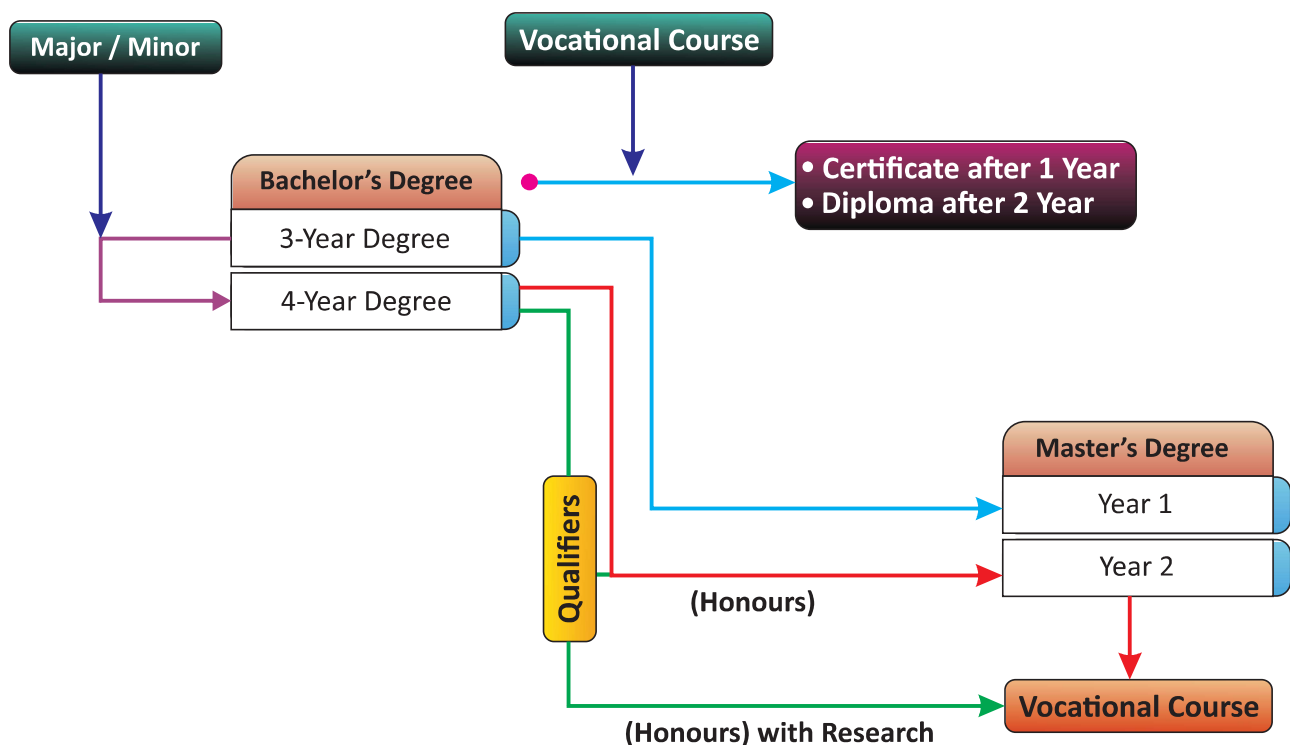
The Four - Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC's Curricular, Framework, published in November 2022.

Duration : The NEP's FYUGP is a 4-year degree programme.

Extra & Entries : In the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice - after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

Progression :

If a student complete the FYUGP after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, she/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree. Under CBCS, there was no such pathways.

- * Students Interested in pursuing Degree in WGC College will have to register both in SAMARTH and college Admission Portal consecutively.
- * Students have to visit portal of Directorate of Higher Education (DHE) and create a UNIQUE ID by registering in the portal which is mandatory (url: <http://dheonlineadmission.amtron.in/sp/#registration>)
- * Students also have to Sign Up in Digilocker and create the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) ID which is mandatory.

7. Now Student portal will open with various options.
8. Click Payment for Prospectus option, after making payment prospectus will be download.
9. Now Click on Admission Option.

11. Now admission form will appear.

13. After Filling up the form click on “Review Form” button to review the form and make corrections, if any.

STUDENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT

Attendance:

Regular attendance in all the classes is mandatory for the Students. Students having a minimum of 75% are declared as regular and are allowed to appear in Council and University exam. If a student has an attendance percentage below 75%, he/she shall be treated as non-collegiate. Moreover, a student failing to attend 60% of the total classes would be declared as dis-collegiate. If a student fails to attend classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes, he/she will forfeit his/her seat.

Discipline among Students:

Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline in the college campus. The college authority lays down certain rules and regulations, violation of which may make a student liable for disciplinary action. Any willful damage of college property would be treated as a serious offence and stern action will be taken in this regard.

**College Uniform :**

Wearing of prescribed uniform in the college campus is mandatory for each and every student. A student breaking the uniform code would not be allowed to enter the college premises. It is also compulsory for each and every student to wear uniform during examinations.

College Identity Card :

Each and every student of the college is issued a non-transferable identity card and it is expected that she/he carries it at all times inside the college premises. In case the card is lost or damaged, concerned authority must be informed immediately.

College Notice Board :

Students are expected to grow the habit of reading the college notice boards regularly. Any notice that has to be circulated in the college through the notice boards must be approved by the college authority.

Ragging :

Ragging in any form inside the college and hostel premises is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in ragging will be subjected to strong disciplinary action as per the directives of the Supreme Court / High Court.

Campus Cleanliness :

It is considered to be the duty of each and every student to keep the college campus clean at all costs. Spitting, writing, and sticking anything on the walls in the college campus will be treated as a punishable offence.

Energy Conservation:

In order to conserve energy, each and every student is expected to grow and practice the habit of switching off fans and lights when not in use.

Tobacco Chewing :

Smoking or chewing of tobacco and paan in any form is strictly prohibited inside the campus.

Silent Zone:

During teaching hours all areas around classrooms shall be treated as silent zones. The authority can take action against students who create disturbance during college teaching hours.

Use of Library:

Students are expected to maintain discipline in the library and be careful in handling.

Parking Facility :

It is compulsory for all students with two-wheelers to submit the copies of their Driving license and Registration Card to the college authority failing which they will not be permitted to avail the parking facility within the college premises.

ABOUT ANTI RAGGING

Students and Parents Undertaking Affidavit In compliance of the second amendment in UGC Regulations, it is compulsory for each student and every parent to submit an online Anti-Ragging undertaking affidavit every academic year. The universities and colleges are also requested to implement the revised procedure for students to file online Anti-Ragging affidavits. The student will receive an e-mail with her/his registration number. The student will forward that e-mail to the Nodal officer in her/his university/college e-mail. (Please note that the student will not receive pdf affidavits and she/he is not required to print & sign it as it used to be in the earlier case).
